The Difference You Make

The Las Vegas Ronald McDonald House continues to offer essential family services during the COVID-19 crisis, by providing a 'home away from home' for families with children in need of critical medical treatment. RMHC of Greater Las Vegas also creates and supports programs that directly improve the health, education, and well-being of children in our own community and beyond.



2020 House Highlights

- 198 families housed for a total of 2,156 nights
- 303 individuals served, including 229 adults and 74 children
- Average length of stay at the 12-bedroom House was 11 days



Our families saved \$259,388 in lodging costs, based on 2020 average nightly lodging rates.

Since 1998, the Las Vegas Ronald McDonald House has served 5,352 families for a total of 65,978 nights.

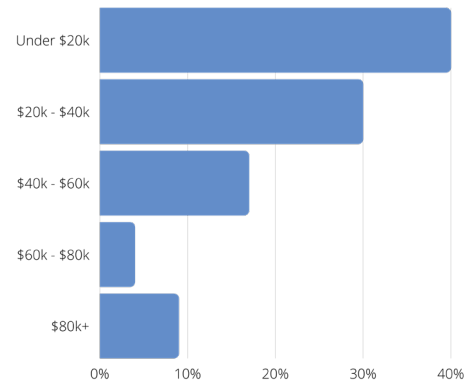

Our Families' Home States

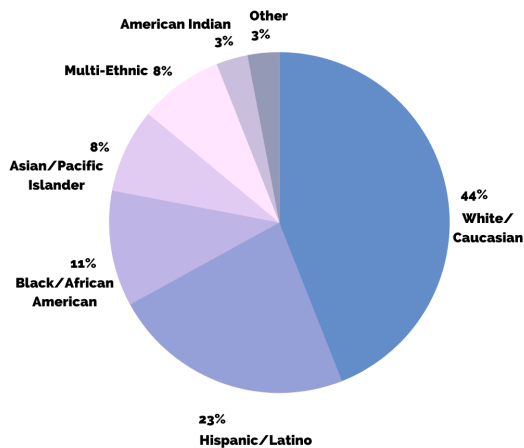


57% of families live in Nevada

COVID-19 Snapshot

- All families received personal protective equipment, homemade meals, and transportation during their stay
- RMHC Las Vegas covered the cost of 172 nights of hotel stays for families during COVID-19 occupancy restrictions
- The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile provided COVID-19 screening and testing to more than 2,000 southern Nevadans
